At shrines, more abundant means of salvation are to be provided for the faithful; the Word of God is to be carefully proclaimed; liturgical life is to be appropriately fostered especially through the celebration of the Eucharist and penance; and approved forms of popular piety are to be cultivated.

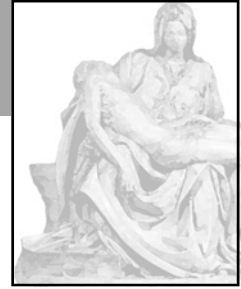

Hurricane Emergency Appeals

Providing Relief to Families Facing Devastation In the past few weeks, major hurricanes have brought catastrophic damage to communities in the United States and throughout the Caribbean.

Hurricane Harvey, a powerful Category 4 hurricane with winds of 130 mph, made landfall near Rockport, Texas early on the morning of Saturday, August 26. The storm hit at peak intensity, and brought flooding to the Gulf Coast – some areas in Central Texas received over 50 inches of rain. The National Weather Service described the disaster as “beyond anything experienced.” Over 30,000 people were displaced by Harvey, and over 70 confirmed fatalities have been reported.

The next week, Hurricane Irma formed, a Category 5 hurricane with sustained winds of 185 mph. Irma has been described as the most powerful Atlantic-based hurricane in recent history, and caused widespread damage throughout the Caribbean, including Barbuda, Saint Barthélemy, Saint Martin, Anguilla, Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico, Haiti, and Cuba. After weakening to Category 3 status, Irma hit Florida, with damaging winds & flooding, particularly to the Keys and along the Gulf Coast.



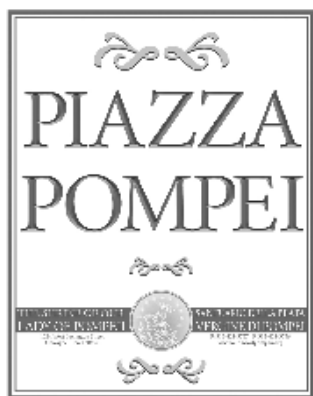
